

Title IX Project: Sex-Specific Search Strategies / One Sheet

School's Basic Information Search

1. Google USnews plus the school name.
 - i. Is it "Public" or "Private"
 - ii. Search for list of Undergraduate students.
 - iii. Search for % of students of each gender.
2. On school site and Internet:
 - i. University president - email, mailing address, links
 - ii. Title IX coordinator - email, mailing address, links
 - iii. Name and title of the General Counsel (the head lawyer for the university) with email, mailing address, and links.

Scholarship Searches

1. Google search for: university name plus scholarships.
2. Google search for university plus "male", "men", "father", "female", "women", or "mother."
3. Google "Academic works" plus school name.
4. Google "NG web solutions" plus school name plus "male" and "women" "father" or "mother."
5. Go to the University website, and search main list of all scholarships and their subheadings.

Program Searches

1. Go to Website – search "women" "men" "male" "men only" "women-only" "female" "girl"
2. On website and on Google – type in the school name plus:
 1. STEM
 2. Faculty awards
 3. Facilities, such as gym hours
 4. Recruiting for students, faculty or staff
 5. Leadership programs
 6. Business programs
 7. Summer programs for middle or high school students
 8. Hiring for any position
 9. Resources
 10. Gender Studies programs for only one specific gender
 11. Women of Color or Men of Color
 12. Engineering programs

Helpful Tips

- Here is a litmus test for violations. Consider this: Ongoing discriminatory single-sex, female-only or male-only programs with a documented history and a documented future.
- Scholarships or programs use the 180-day rule. No need to note any program or scholarship older than 6 months.
- For events or programs, if both genders are invited to the event, these are not Title IX violations.
- There are such things as Internal scholarships (sponsored by the college) as well as External scholarships (sponsored by an agency outside of the college). Definitely list the "internal" scholarships in your documentation, but you CAN list "external" scholarships IF THEY ARE PROMOTED as single sex by the University website.
- No need to list scholarship regarding single-sex sports.
- No need to list "women's centers" as a violation of single-sex program.
